3	<p>Memorandum relating two gold cups made by Le Chartier Goldsmith bequeathed by Lady Palmerston. There are two later notes on the paper: at the bottom of the page "taken out by Lady P and in her dressing room, March 26 1803" and at the side of the page, in the hand of W.W.Ashley "these had belonged previously to Abraham Houblon, Lady Palmerston's father."</p>	1803
