Enabling Services

We provide a range of services for specific, short or long-term needs. These include offering support to students experiencing specific learning difficulties (such as dyslexia or dyspraxia) and students with a wide range of disabilities including visual impairments, hearing impairments, mobility impairments, wheelchair users, Autistic Spectrum Disorders (such as Asperger's syndrome) epilepsy, diabetes or temporary conditions (such as a broken leg). Our services are available on the main Highfield campus as well as the other campuses. Support includes:

- Arrangements for additional examination requirements
- Dyslexia assessment and specialist support
- Disability advice and guidance including arranging access to specialist equipment, supporting applications for accommodation in halls of residence, parking permit applications
- Mentoring
- Counselling
- Needs assessment (for the Disabled Students' Allowance)
- Assistive technology

You will need to register with us at Enabling Services to access support.

The Disabled Students' Allowance (DSA)
