



Early career researcher BBSRC Excellence with Impact sequencing grant application rules:

1. Applicant must be early career researcher (less than 4 years post-*viva* on 30th May 2016);
2. Applications must be 100 words or less, plus a project title, and be sent by 11th May to bing@oton.ac.uk;
3. Ethical approval (if required) must be in place on application;
4. All funds (maximum £2,000) must be spent on nucleic acid sample preparation and the generation of next-generation sequence data (of any species);
5. ECR applicant must lead the project although others may be involved in the project;
6. Funds must be spent within one year of award;
7. Shortlisted entries will be required to give a short presentation on 18th May prior to final decision;
8. Successful applicant will present work in 2017 NGS Symposium;
9. Decision of judges is final.

BINGS Poster competition rules:

1. Applicants must submit poster title to bing@oton.ac.uk by 11th May;
2. 1st place and two runner up prizes will be awarded (£100 and 2x £50 Amazon vouchers as prize respectively);
3. Due to limitations on presentation space, applications will be accepted on a first come, first served basis in the event of oversubscription.
4. All participants should submit one printed poster in A0 size, laminated, and in portrait orientation.
