
#### **FOLLOW-UP**

Primary outcome (16-week questionnaire):

92%

Secondary outcome (16-week AND 52-week questionnaires):

87%



### **Prescribing for BATHE**

Even though recruitment is complete, many participants have only just come on board and so will need our support for the next 12 months.

The study teams will continue to help with any non-clinical problems and also encourage participants to complete their questionnaires by posting out newsletters and birthday cards.

It would be very helpful if you could support the families taking part by reminding yourself of the study basics:

Children in the BATHE Study are randomised to receive either:

- Usual care with bath emollient or
- Usual care without bath emollient

Participants can use any other medications as they normally would

We have recommended these bath emollients for the BATHE Study because they are the most commonly used:

Oilatum Fragrance Free Junior Balneum Bath Oil Aveeno Bath Oil

Participants in the with bath emollient group may use which-

ever bath emollient they prefer, but please avoid prescribing products which contain anti-pruritics or antimicrobials. There is more information in the Site File and on the study website. Please help participants by setting up a repeat prescription for larger bottles.

Parents who find it impossible to stick to their allocated group for any reason should **not** be withdrawn from the study but encouraged to continue to complete the questionnaires wherever possible.
