


# Special Collections subject guides Food and Drink

#### Introduction

With nearly 7 million manuscript items and 50,000 printed books, the Special Collections, Hartley Library, provide a resource of remarkable richness and depth. Within the Archives and Manuscripts are the papers of the first Duke of Wellington, third Viscount Palmerston, and papers for the foundation of the states of India and Pakistan in the archive of Earl Mountbatten of Burma. Southampton is also home to one of the largest Jewish archives in Western Europe. Printed collections of note are the Parkes Library on Jewish/non-Jewish relations, the Cope Collection on Hampshire and the Isle of Wight, the Perkins Agricultural Library and the Wellington Pamphlets.



This guide gives an overview of the aspects of Food and Drink on which you can find material in Special Collections, together with relevant examples.

#### **Food Cultivation**

#### **Archival Collections**

These include plans for planting and uses of fields; works on agricultural experiments; essays on the culture of potatoes; papers on stocks and pedigrees of cattle, and practical guides on agriculture.

#### **Printed Collections**

The <u>Perkins Agricultural Library</u> contains pre-1900 publications on all aspects of agriculture, including handbooks of farm management, books on agricultural chemistry and on individual crops and animal husbandry. Books on farming in Hampshire are found in the <u>Cope</u> Collection.

## **Food Preparation/Recipes**

#### **Archive Collections**



These include papers on the affairs of shechita; correspondence relating to school meals; recipe books; speeches on food safety; memoranda on cooking equipment, and reports showing dishes considered for different types of cooking and attendance numbers for cookery courses.

#### **Printed Collections**

The <u>Rare Books Collection</u> and the <u>Perkins Agricultural Library</u> have small numbers of books which contain recipes, dating from the 18th century onwards. The <u>Parkes Library</u> contains publications on Jewish dietary laws, shechita and on ethnographic aspects of Jewish food traditions.

## **Household management**

## **Archival Collections**

These include lists of stock and tenants; account books; and correspondence on the recruitment of kitchen staff, which are hold mainly in our Broadlands and Congleton estate paper collections (MS 62 and MS 64), as well as in the Carver Manuscripts and Lady Swaythling papers (MS 63 and MS383).

## **Food Consumption**

#### **Archival Collections**



These include passages in journals describing the making of liquors and methods used to thaw frozen supplies; accounts, table plans, dinner books, admission tickets, menu cards, photographs relating to dinners arranged for special occasions; and reports on the provision of food.

#### **Food Relief**

#### **Archival Collections**

These include records of charities, committees, and individuals providing food assistance to those less fortunate, such as reports, photographs, correspondence.

#### **Printed Collections**

The <u>Cope Collection on Hampshire and the Isle of Wight</u> contains examples of publications relating to the provision of food in times of need, such as handbills and reports. Books on Jewish charities within the <u>Parkes</u> <u>Library</u> often contain references to food provision.

## **Food Supplies**

These include estate and military account books; price lists; and correspondence relating to food shortages on military campaigns.

#### **Printed Collections**

Both the <u>Perkins Agricultural Library</u> and the <u>Wellington Pamphlets</u> contain publications on the economics of food production and supply. The <u>Cope Collection</u> includes reports on Southampton Docks which contain information on foodstuffs imported and exported as well as duties payable.
