



Our history

You may already know that the University of Southampton received its Royal Charter on 29 April 1952, in the early weeks of the reign of HM Queen Elizabeth II. In fact, our roots go back much further than this – to 1862. This is when the Hartley Institution was established in the city centre, following a bequest by Henry Robinson Hartley, the son of a local wine merchant, to the Corporation of Southampton. Located in Below Bar, the Hartley Institution was opened by the then Prime Minister, Lord Palmerston.

In 1902 it was renamed Hartley College, before becoming Hartley University College and, later, University College, Southampton. The Hartley name is still remembered in the Hartley Library that we all know and love.

We were honoured to be the first university to be granted a Royal Charter by Queen Elizabeth II, two months after her accession to the throne.

The Royal Charter enabled Southampton for the first time to award its own degrees as a fully independent university, after many years as a degree-awarding branch of the University of London.

Our University today

We've come a long way since then; from a student cohort of around 850 undergraduate and postgraduate students, we now have over 25,000 studying across our campuses in Southampton, Winchester and Malaysia. We welcome and support bright and motivated students from over 130 countries to be the best they can be, pioneer flexible learning and encourage interdisciplinary practice across our academic community.








The future

HONORARY GRADUATES



Vinton G Cerf Doctor of Science

Vinton G Cerf is Vice-President and Chief Internet Evangelist for Google. He is the co-designer of the TCP/ IP protocols and the architecture of the internet. He has served in executive positions at the Internet Corporation of Assigned Names and Numbers, the Internet Society, MCI, the Corporation for National Research Initiatives, and the US Defense Advanced Research Projects Agency.

A former Stanford professor and former member of the US National Science Board, he is also the past President of the Association for Computing Machinery, Emeritus Chair of the Marconi Society and serves in advisory capacities at the US National Institute of Standards and Technology, US Department of Energy, US National Science Foundation, US Navy, JPL and the US National Reconnaissance Office.

He earned his BS Mathematics at Stanford and MS Computer Science and PhD Computer Science degrees at UCLA. He is a member of the US National Academies of Science and Engineering, the Worshipful Company of Information Technologists, and the Worshipful Company

Vinton is a recipient of numerous awards for his work, including: the US Presidential Medal of Freedom, US National Medal of Technology, the Queen Elizabeth Prize for Engineering, the Prince of Asturias Award, the Japan Prize, the Charles Stark Draper Award, the ACM Turing Award, the Marconi Prize and Marconi Lifetime Achievement Award, the IEEE Medal of Honor, the Legion d'Honneur, the VinFutures Grand Prize and the Franklin Medal. He is a Foreign Member of the British Royal Society and Swedish Academy of Engineering, and holds 29 honorary degrees.



Doctor of Science

Professor Lucy Chappell is the Chief Scientific Adviser to the Department of Health and Social Care (DHSC), reporting to Professor Sir Chris Whitty, the Chief Medical Officer.

As the Chief Scientific Adviser, Lucy has overall responsibility for DHSC research and development and for supporting analysis and life sciences across the department. She provides science advice to ministers across a range of health topics and is involved in cross-government science policy.

Lucy is also Chief Executive Officer for the National Institute for Health and Care Research (NIHR), the research delivery vehicle for the UK Department of Health and Social Care.

The NIHR delivers world-leading research in health and social care that improves people's health and wellbeing benefiting individuals and our wider society through economic growth. It is the UK's largest funder of health and care research, providing over one billion pounds of funding for research every year.

In addition to these major national roles, Lucy is Professor of Obstetrics at King's College London, working mainly in clinical trials in pregnancy, and a practicing Consultant Obstetrician at Guy's and St Thomas' NHS Foundation Trust.

Lucy is a Fellow of the Royal College of Obstetricians and Gynaecologists (FRCOG) and has been awarded a Fellowship of the Academy of Medical Sciences (FMedSci) for the excellence of her science and contribution to medicine and society. She was also awarded a Gold Medal for her work in the field of reproduction by the Blair Bell Research Society in 1999.



Gerd Gigerenzer Doctor of Science

Gerd Gigerenzer, Director at the Max Planck Institute for Human Development, is Director of the Harding Center for Risk Literacy at the University of Potsdam, partner of Simply Rational - The Institute for Decisions, and Vice-President of the European Research Council (ERC).

He is former Professor of Psychology at the University of Chicago and John M Olin Distinguished Visiting Professor at the School of Law at the University of Virginia.

In addition, he is a member of the Berlin-Brandenburg Academy of Sciences, the German Academy of Sciences and an honorary member of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences and the American Philosophical Society. Gerd is also Batten Fellow at the Darden Business School, University of Virginia.

Awards for Gerd's work include: the AAAS Prize for the best article in the behavioral sciences, the Association of American Publishers Prize for the best book in the social and behavioral sciences, the German Psychology Award, and the Communicator Award of the German Research Foundation.

His award-winning popular books Calculated Risks, Gut Feelings, Risk Savvy, and How To Stay Smart In A Smart World have been translated into more than 20 languages.

Together with the Bank of England, he is working on the project Simple Heuristics for a Safer World. He has trained US federal judges, German physicians, and international top managers in decision-making and understanding risks and uncertainties.

The Swiss Duttweiler Institute has distinguished Gerd as one of the top 100 Global Thought Leaders worldwide.

LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT

Jayanti Shah MBE

BSc Mechanical Engineering, 1971

Since arriving in Southampton in 1968, Jayanti has been an anti-racism campaigner in the city. In 2020, he received an MBE for services to promoting anti-racism in Southampton and Hampshire.

During this time, Jayanti has held multiple prominent voluntary positions in the Southampton Race Equality Council and contributed to the work of the city's race sub-committee in the past. He is currently Director of Positive Message, a non-profit organisation promoting racial inclusivity and tackling discrimination.

Jayanti is the Co-founder of Black History Month (BHM) in Southampton and his involvement has made it a success in the city.

Jayanti was a city ambassador for the 2025 City of Culture bid. He is a trustee of Artswork organisation. He continues with the same message, 'People are people' and in 2022, his TEDx talk was entitled Anti-racism - when there is only one human race.

He is also an engaged member of Southampton's alumni community, driving forward a local alumni network in the Southampton area. Jayanti has used his energy to help create an inclusive culture in Southampton over several decades.



RISING STAR

Dr Jahangir Alom BEM

BM6 Medicine, 2018

Jahangir graduated with the Deans Prize for Outstanding Contribution to the Faculty of Medicine. During his time at Southampton, he set up the Widening Access to Medicine Society (WAMSoc), working with over 1,000 school pupils in Hampshire. He was also the MedSoc President in 2016.

Jahangir was National Clinical Lead for the Staff COVID-19 Vaccine Programme at NHS England, leading the engagement strategy that saw 147,000 of the most hesitant healthcare workers get vaccinated. Jahangir is the Programme Director of an international charity, Selfless UK, which delivers evidence-based global health projects in rural Bangladesh.

Jahangir is a School Governor at Stepney All Saints School, a board member at the Institute of Public Policy Research, and a full time emergency medicine doctor.

He has received an NHS Parliamentary Award and British Empire Medal for services to tackling health inequalities in the King's New Years Honours List 2024. Jahangir is an expert in health inequalities and has provided commentary on the BBC, SkyNews, Channel 4 and CNN.



CIVIC AWARD

Veronica Gordon

BSc Social Policy and Administration, 2005

Veronica Gordon is a broadcast journalist turned social entrepreneur who uses her media skills, knowledge, and insight to empower Black and underrepresented communities.

She is the Founder of Our Version Media (OVM), a Southampton-based social enterprise leveraging digital media for social good.

Veronica combined her 15 years of journalism expertise (ITV regional news, BBC local radio, Unity 101 Community Radio, and digital media) with her 15 years of community activism to create OVM. Its mission is to amplify Black voices and tackle the harmful narratives perpetuated by traditional media.

OVM increases the positive visibility of Black communities by teaching digital media and journalism skills, enabling individuals to tell and share their own, authentic stories.

Veronica is also an award-winning radio personality and Founder of Vibrant Vibes, Southampton's leading African, Caribbean, and Black British community radio show.

In 2024, Veronica joined the Code Committee for Impress, the UK's independent press regulator, expanding her work to contribute to a more trustworthy, fair, and representative media landscape at a national level.



ALUMNI SERVICE

Chris Spackman

BSc Maths and Computer Science, 1981

After graduating from the University, Chris started work at Honeywell writing software for power station control systems. He then led a team introducing 'chip and pin' cards into the UK with Barclaycard. This led him into a career in computer security and resilience with American Express.

In 1994 he joined a team negotiating and implementing an early IT outsourcing deal for American Express. He was appointed to manage the \$450m arrangement, which didn't go well! However, this experience set him up for the rest of his career, advising on complex outsourcing deals with major multinational companies.

In 2016 he helped establish the University's Future Worlds start-up accelerator and remains a volunteer business mentor, giving a huge amount of time to help researchers and students bring their innovations to the market. He's also been a major supporter of the University's Ignite Programme helping undergraduates overcome challenges to thrive.

Chris has also volunteered for several national and local charities helping young people to reach their potential and older people stay independent.



ALUMNI SERVICE

Pascal Ezeabasili

BEng Aeronautics and Astronautics,

Pascal joined the University in 2016 from Seven Kings High School in Ilford and spent four years taking advantage of all the opportunities Southampton had to offer: teaching English as a foreign language in China, completing internships both at the University and in China with technology giant Huawei, and volunteering for the Engineering Society as Vice President for two years.

Upon graduating in 2020, Pascal was among the first volunteers to take part in the University's Graduate Ambassador Scheme, a programme that helps new graduates connect with current students to offer advice and support recruitment and employability at Southampton, stepping up to serve as a lead Graduate Ambassador in 2022.

Pascal's personal journey resonates profoundly with aspiring students facing similar challenges. He has run several networking workshops for students, contributed to focus groups and panels, and provided particular support to the University's widening participation agenda, through initiatives like the Ignite Programme and presentations to partner schools.

OUR CHANCELLORS

We are delighted to announce the appointment of the Rt Hon Justine Greening and Lord Patel of Bradford as our new University Chancellors. This is the first time the University has appointed two Chancellors, and their initial term will be for five years.

The Chancellor role is that of the leading ambassador of the University through activities linked to our strategy.

In their role, Justine and Patel will preside over graduation ceremonies and play an active role in other aspects of the University's development.

Justine graduated from Southampton with first class honours in 1990 with a degree in Business Economics and Accounting. She was elected Conservative MP for Putney, Roehampton and Southfields in 2005 and remained an MP until 2019. She has had various roles in the Cabinet including serving as Secretary of State for Education and Minister for Women and Equalities from July 2016 to January 2018, during which time she launched the Social Mobility Action Plan and the Gender Pay Gap regulations. Since leaving Parliament in late 2019, Justine has campaigned for social mobility and equality of opportunity. In July 2023 she was awarded an honorary doctorate at Southampton.

Lord Patel began his career as a social worker, later moving into academia and government roles relating to health, education and social care. He was awarded an OBE in 1999 for services to ethnic minority health issues. He is a member of the House of Lords and was made a life peer in 2006. In 2018, he was appointed Chair of Social Work England, the regulator for child, family and adult social workers in England. He is Chair of the India Business Group.

Lord Patel also already has links to the University, as a valued patron for The India Centre for Inclusive Growth and Sustainable Development. He was awarded an honorary degree in 2018.

- The procession music will start and the congregation will stand as the procession enters O2 Guildhall.

- The President and Vice-Chancellor will address the congregation.
- The President and Vice-Chancellor will announce the purpose of the congregation.
- The sections of the charter and statutes, which relate to the establishment of the University and the appointment of the Chancellors will be read.
- A citation will be read for each Chancellor.
- The Chancellors will be invited to speak.
- There will be a vote of thanks, and the President and Vice-Chancellor will declare the installation ceremony closed.
- Guests will remain seated, and the graduation ceremony will begin.

Professor Sir Ian Diamond

Chair of Council

Since August 2018, Sir Ian has been the National Statistician and Permanent Secretary of the Office for National Statistics

Prior to this role he was Chief Executive of the Economic and Statistics Research Council, from 2003–2010, and Principal and Vice-Chancellor of the University of Aberdeen, from 2010–2018.

These roles followed almost 23 years at the University of Southampton where he was Lecturer, Professor, Head of Social Statistics, Dean of Social Sciences and Deputy Vice-Chancellor.

Sir lan is a passionate teacher and researcher who has worked on the analysis of large and complex data sets most notably in population, and on census design and analysis. His research has crossed many disciplinary boundaries and he has worked with several government departments both in the UK and internationally.

He has also chaired British Universities and Colleges Sport, Lloyds Bank Foundation for England and Wales, and Edinburgh College of Further Education. He is currently chairing Plan International UK.

Sir Ian has also been a board member of: WWF UK; UK Research and Innovation; UCAS; Universities UK; Lancaster University; and the Iona Cathedral Trust.



 ${\bf Colin\,Smith\,CBE}$

Pro-Chancellor

Colin Smith retired as Group President Rolls-Royce in May 2017.

Colin was a member of the Board of Rolls-Royce as Director of Engineering and Technology from 2005 to 2016. Prior to this role, he was the Director of Research and Technology for the company, building on his previous experience as Director of Engineering and Technology for Civil Aerospace. He joined the company as an undergraduate apprentice before graduating from the University of Southampton.

Colin was Chairman of Sheffield Forgemasters for three years until January 2023 and a non-executive director of Bekaert.

In June 2012, Colin was awarded a CBE for services to UK engineering. He is a Fellow of The Royal Society, the Royal Academy of Engineering, The Royal Aeronautical Society and The Institution of Mechanical Engineers. He was the recipient of a Royal Academy of Engineering Silver Medal in 2002.

Colin has been awarded honorary doctorates by the Universities of Derby, Loughborough, Nottingham, Oxford, Southampton and Strathclyde.

He has been Chairman of UK Industry Aerospace Growth Partnership, a former member of the UK Prime Minister's Council for Science and Technology, President of ADS (the industry trade body for Aerospace, Defence and Security) and remains a Pro-Chancellor of the University.



Jon Sopel Pro-Chancellor

Journalist and broadcaster Jon Sopel is the presenter of the award-winning daily news podcast *The News Agents*, which he presents with Emily Maitlis. Before that, he enjoyed a distinguished career with the BBC, most recently spending eight years in Washington DC as the North America Editor.

Jon is the author of the bestseller If Only They Didn't Speak English: Notes from Trump's America and three other books. His new book, Strangeland: How Britain stopped making sense is published in September. An alumnus of the University, Jon has a long association with Southampton.



Philip Greenish CBEPro-Chancellor

Philip was Chair of Council, the University's governing body, from 2018 until April 2024 having served as a lay member since 2012. He is a member of the Audit Risk and Assurance Committee of UK Research and Innovation (UKRI) and the of Audit Committee of the British Academy.

He was Chief Executive of the Royal Academy of Engineering from 2003 until December 2017 following his first career in the Royal Navy, from which he retired as a Rear Admiral. He has served as a Council member of two of the UK's Research Councils and as a trustee of a number of charities.

He was educated at Cheltenham College and Durham University where he read Engineering Science, graduating in 1972, and he is a graduate of the Royal College of Defence Studies. He is a Chartered Engineer, an Honorary Fellow of the Royal Academy of Engineering and a Fellow of the Institution of Engineering and Technology.

He was a board member of Engineering UK from 2008 to 2018. He holds an Honorary Doctorate from Huddersfield University. He was awarded a CBE in 2003.



Dame Veronica SutherlandPro-Chancellor

Dame Veronica Sutherland studied German at the Universities of London and later Southampton, where she gained an MA in 1965. She then joined the Diplomatic Service, and served overseas in Copenhagen, New Delhi and Paris, where she was the British Delegate to UNESCO. In 1987 she was appointed Ambassador to the Ivory Coast, Burkina Faso and Niger, becoming the first married woman ambassador in the British Diplomatic Service. She retired in 1999 after four years as Ambassador in Dublin.

On leaving the Diplomatic Service she was appointed Deputy Secretary General (Economic and Social) in the Commonwealth Secretariat. From 2001–2008 she was President of Lucy Cavendish College, University of Cambridge.

She and her husband live just outside Cambridge where she is involved in various charities and in her spare time enjoys painting.

CEREMONIAL OFFICERS



Professor Mark E. Smith CBE

President and Vice-Chancellor

As President and Vice-Chancellor, Mark is the Chief Executive of the University and has overall responsibility for its operations. He took up this role on 1 October 2019.

Mark was Vice-Chancellor at Lancaster University from 2012 until September 2019. He was previously Deputy Vice-Chancellor of the University of Warwick.

Throughout his academic career, he has published more than 380 papers about advanced magnetic resonance techniques, helping to understand a range of problems in the field of materials physics.

Mark holds several external appointments including Senior Independent Member of UKRI EPSRC's Council; and board member of the Higher Education Funding Council for Wales, chairing their Research Wales Committee.

He was awarded a CBE for Services to Research and Higher Education in the 2019 Queen's Birthday Honours.



Phil has a vital role in promoting and maintaining the University's academic mission including having oversight of all academic planning across faculties and ensuring the alignment of resources with the University's strategic goals. He provides a key focus for ensuring a One Southampton approach to a range of strategic activities including championing the development of an Estates and Sustainability agenda.

Phil is a Professor of Chemical Engineering. In his research, he uses synthetic biology and metabolic engineering approaches to improve energy generation and production of biopharmaceuticals.

He focuses on measurement (primarily using biological mass spectrometry) and integration of multi-level biological data (eg proteomic and mRNA data), mathematical tools and characterising omics-scale data.

Phil has published over 200 peer-reviewed journal papers and has been an investigator on approximately £10m of external research funding. He is a Fellow of the Institution of Chemical Engineers and a Chartered Engineer.



Professor Deborah Gill

Vice-President (Education and Student Experience)

Deborah joined Southampton in April 2022 from University College London (UCL) where she was Interim Vice-Provost, Education and Student Experience.

She began her academic career in 1996, combining academic work with clinical practice as a GP in North London for over 20 years.

She has pioneered the integration of community-based education in medicine programmes and published extensively in a range of clinical education areas including doctors as teachers, personal and professional identity formation in new doctors, and transnational medical education.

Awarded a Chair in Medical Education at UCL in 2015, she went on to lead UCL Medical School for six years where she developed a highly successful education consultancy unit that has supported medicine programmes and educators in Europe and the Far and Middle East.

Deborah is a Fellow of the Royal College of General Practitioners and Principal Fellow of the Higher Education Academy.



Professor Jane Falkingham CBE

Vice-President

(Engagement and International)

As Vice President (Engagement and International), Jane is leading on our Civic University strategy, working in partnership with our key stakeholders - locally, regionally, nationally and globally. She is especially proud of being the sponsor for our recent application to become a University of Sanctuary.

Jane is also leading the University's Equality, Diversity and Inclusion strategic plan and is committed to the University being a place where all students and staff feel that they belong and can be their true selves.

As Professor of Demography and International Social Policy at the University of Southampton, Jane is also the Director of the ESRC Centre for Population Change. Her remit is to improve understanding of the drivers and consequences of population change and she is also the principal investigator of the new ESRC Connecting Generations research collaboration.

Jane has a long history of service to the academic community both in the UK and internationally. From 2017-2022, she was a Member of ESRC Council and chaired the COVID-19 Rapid Response funding panel. Jane was President of the British Society for Population Studies (2015–2017) and President of the European Association for Population Studies (2018–2020).

She was elected as a Fellow of the UK Academy of Social Sciences in 2011 and the Royal Society of Arts in 2016. In January 2023, Jane was named as a Commander of the British Empire (CBE) in the King's first New Year's Honours.



Professor Andrew Atherton

Vice-President (International and Engagement)

Andrew takes the lead on all matters relating to international, Chairs the University's International Executive Group, and is responsible for the business aspects of engagement.

As Vice-President International and Engagement, Andrew oversees the University's international strategy and its key priorities, which focus on developing a globally engaged and active university.

Andrew is also Professor of Entrepreneurship at the University. He has published extensively in the area of small business and entrepreneurship, with a particular focus on new venture creation, enterprise policy and entrepreneurship in China.

Externally, Andrew has been Global Director for Transnational Education at Navitas, a leading global education company, until July 2023. Before joining Southampton, he was Vice-Chancellor of the University of Dundee, and before that Deputy Vice-Chancellor at Lancaster University and Senior Deputy Vice-Chancellor at the University of Lincoln.

Professor Mark Spearing

Vice-President (Research and Enterprise)

Mark has responsibility for the University's research and enterprise. He also works closely with the Vice-President (Education and Student Experience) and the Director of the Doctoral College to ensure the development of students undertaking doctoral degrees.

He maintains that his is one of the best jobs in the University, as every day he works with amazing people, doing amazing things, with the potential to change our world and our understanding of it (and the wider Universe).

He has been at Southampton for 20 years in a variety of roles. Previously he spent 10 years as Professor of Aeronautics and Astronautics at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology. This followed periods working in industry and as a research fellow at the University of California. Santa Barbara.

He received a BA and PhD in Engineering from the University of Cambridge. His teaching and research are in the areas of engineering materials and structures. He is currently excited about using high-resolution computed tomography to understand failure processes in advanced composite materials; working with material developers and structural designers to produce stronger and more durable systems for aerospace, gas storage and wind turbines.

Mark is also a fellow of the Royal Aeronautical Society.

She is also the University's lead for research culture, focusing on building and sustaining a positive culture that supports the wellbeing of our research community and helps them to do their best research.


Rebecca is a Professor of Mathematics. Her own research is interdisciplinary, applying mathematical modelling in the life and social sciences. She is also a Fellow of the Institute of Mathematics and its Applications, and won its inaugural Hedy Lamarr Prize for Knowledge Exchange in Mathematics and its Applications in 2021 for 'sustained contributions to knowledge exchange in the mathematical sciences, creating new links between academia and the wider world, and inspiring, enhancing and supporting others in their knowledge exchange'.

PROFESSOR TURNED STUDENT GRADUATES

From bricklayer, to professor, to artist – Professor David Birks has come full circle and is graduating this summer with a Master's in Fine Art from the Winchester School of Art.

It is his second qualification from the University of Southampton – having graduated first time with a Master's in Social Statistics in 1993.

David, who lives in central Winchester, incorporated the bricklaying skills that he acquired as a teenager into his final project – a large sculpture of an inside out house, incorporating bricks, woodwork, painting and handmade tiles and wallpaper.


"Working for my final show piece was physically and mentally challenging. I wanted to bring everything together, from working as a bricklayer and working as a professor, into one final piece. It was very personal and has been a lovely process to go through," says David.

David left school at 15 and began his working life as a bricklayer, until he completed a degree, master's and PhD in business studies and then embarked on a career in academia, specialising in marketing research.

He lectured at the University of Strathclyde, the University of Bath, and then the University of Southampton where he worked in the Business School and established the school's MSc in Marketing Analytics.

In 2009, David moved to Winchester School of Art, where he was instrumental in setting up the master's degrees in Design Management and Luxury Brand Management. Finally, from 2013 to his retirement in 2016, he was Director of the Business School and Dean of Faculty at the University of Winchester.

"I got the bug for art as soon as I retired. I have always had a passion for crafts and the lives of crafters. It feels fantastic to be graduating in fine art, to build on my passions and continue a journey of self-discovery."



Aviator Ellie Carter was Britain's youngest ever female pilot – but she doesn't have her head in the clouds.

Just 17 when she got her licence, she has clocked up thousands of air miles, flies her plane into Europe, and has starred in a BBC documentary about her life in the sky.

"I don't come from a flying background or a wealthy family," said Ellie, who commutes to Southampton from her home in Devon. "I joined a gliding club as a teen and realised I was good at it.

"My first solo fight was in a glider at 14. Looking back at it now makes me laugh because I went back to school the next day and I wasn't allowed to use a glue gun."

Now in her final year of studying a degree in aeronautics and astronautics, Ellie still finds time to get into the air while finishing her coursework. "Very few of my friends know that I can fly - but my licence allows me to fly passengers, so I might take them up when we graduate this summer."

Being Britain's youngest female pilot has propelled her into the limelight – and last year Ellie was approached by a BBC documentary team to help her break another record by flying a century-old warplane.

In doing so, she will become the first woman to pilot a refurbished Sopwith Strutter aircraft which helped the British to victory in the First World War.

"There's a famous saying that you're born to fly," Ellie says, "and that's how I feel every day – being in the sky is freeing and there is something very beautiful about it.

"It would be nice to see more young female pilots – you don't need to come from a flying family or have lots of money to start."



A formula racing car built by students from the University has run its final lap and found a home on the podium at the National Motor Museum in Beaulieu.

The single-seat racer, engineered by our undergraduates, has been retired after several seasons challenging for top spot in the Formula Student competition.

The petrol-powered vehicle was named Stag 6B by the team and becomes the only formula racing car of its kind in Beaulieu's famous collection.


Final-year student Keira Byrne, who leads the Southampton team, has already landed her first job at Aston Martin's F1 outfit and will start after graduating this summer.

She said: "It's wonderful to see something we built from scratch being displayed at the museum alongside some of the world's most famous vehicles. Our car looks a little different from everything else at Beaulieu so it really stands out.

"We hope it shows children who love motorsport like we do that getting into the sport is attainable and you don't need much background or experience to start."

The Formula Student competition sees UK universities build and race their own cars at the biggest tracks across Europe, including Silverstone.

It is a tournament which the University of Southampton has been competing in for the last decade – but only the Stag 6B car has come close to winning it, finishing second in its class and

"I've also played in large venues such as the Royal Albert Hall, London Palladium, London Stadium, Amsterdam Concertgebouw, KKL Lucerne, and Berlin Konzerthaus with the likes of Robbie Williams, Clean Bandit, Chineke! Orchestra and DON BROCO," she says.

During her studies, she has also been President of the University of Southampton Jazz Orchestra since 2023, and as a multi-instrumentalist playing bass, viola, violin and piano, she is also a private music tutor based in Croydon.

Post-graduation, Genevieve aims to study a master's jazz bass degree at Conservatoire, continue performing, writing music and teaching. She would also like to start a small coffee business selling brewing equipment and unique coffee.



CAMPAIGNING FOR EQUITY FOR ALL

Final year education student Lottie James is passionate about creating a truly inclusive university community with equity at its heart, and this is reflected in the work she has done at the University and SUSU throughout her studies.

"Staff-student partnerships are crucial to ensuring the community is inclusive and accessible to all. In my time here, I have taken on roles with the aim of supporting the University to be more suitable for all its students."

Lottie has sat on committees for societies like the Education Society and the Neurodiversity and Disability Society and been Disabilities Officer for SUSU in her third year. She was also elected to the role of Vice-President of Education and Democracy taking a year outside of her studies representing students' academic and democracy interests.

During her first two years of study she also created a Pagan and Witchcraft Society that aimed to create a safe space for pagans and spiritual students across the University. This has led to the recruitment of a Pagan Faith Advisor in the Faith and Reflection Centre.

"As a first-generation, mature student with neurodiverse conditions and a disability, I feel the lived experience to help affect real change and impact."

After graduation this summer, Lottie will be taking on the role of Vice-President of Welfare & Community for the 2024/25 academic year, representing students' welfare and community interests at SUSU.

"My key priorities are true neurodiversity and disability representation – academic and non-academic.

"I also want to work with clubs and societies to make sure that their activities are more inclusive for neurodiverse and disabled students. I know first-hand wanting to join a sports society, but feeling like you wouldn't fit in or be accommodated."



HIGHLIGHTING OUR VIBRANT INTERNATIONAL COMMUNITY

Final-year marketing management student Balaji Coimbatore Senthilkumar has taken advantage of an internship at the University that has helped him get ready for his future career, while also helping international students to get the most out of their time at Southampton.

As a student from India, Balaji has first-hand experience of moving to the UK to study.

"Through my internship in the University's International Office, I am helping to promote opportunities tailored towards our diverse community of international students, of which I am also a part," he says.

"As an International Student Officer, I engage with the student community, tapping into their unique stories and perspectives on international student life. I also collaborate with various international societies to create engaging content that reflects the rich diversity on campus."

Through his work in the International Office, Balaji has also gained a real-world understanding of marketing strategies, public relations and coordinating events.

"Working with the International Office has helped me gain a lot of experience, which will come in useful as I hope to become a marketing consultant one day," he adds.



POWERING INTO THE FUTURE

Final-year oceanography student Megan Thorn has taken advantage of her time at the University to prepare for her future in many ways, but arguably the most exhilarating has been gaining her powerboat qualification.

Megan explains that she wanted to study oceanography ever since her work experience at Southampton docks as a teenager. "Southampton was my local university and it became my first choice due to proximity, but also due to its reputation in coastal sciences and links with the National Oceanography Centre Southampton (NOCS) – the home of the University's Waterfront Campus," she says.

Megan's powerboat qualification is something that could set her apart in the jobs market after she graduates this summer, as it's not something that all students get to do. "It's so calming being on the water, it's just you, the boat and the sea." she says.

In addition to her powerboating, Megan has also attended Ocean Business – ocean tech exhibition and training exhibition – at NOCS several times, attended careers fairs – one of which has led to a job offer after she graduates this summer – and been involved in the clay pigeon shooting club and RockSOC.

Megan has also accessed a lot of the wellbeing resources to help her through some significant life events through several years of her degree, which worsened her depression and anxiety. "Without the support of my personal academic tutor, supervisor, the sports pass, the support of the wellbeing practitioners and counsellors, I would not be in a place to start my life post university in a good headspace so I am eternally grateful."



ENSURING ALL VOICES ARE HEARD

Final-year marketing student Yasmine Gendy has dedicated her time at Southampton to creating a safe and welcoming community for all students, as well as enabling the voices of students from underrepresented groups to be heard.

Yasmine has taken on many roles within SUSU during her four years at the University.

As Chair of SUSU Senate from 2023, Yasmine has a pivotal role in representing the student body and ensuring all voices are heard. Her proactive approach to building relationships with fellow students has allowed her to establish strong connections, enabling her to effectively advocate for their interests and concerns.

A HELPING HAND FOR STROKE SURVIVORS

A team from the University of Southampton has invented an electronic glove that enables movement in the paralysed hands of stroke survivors – supporting their rehabilitation.

The glove has electrodes printed on the sleeve that touch the skin. The electrodes send electronic impulses to stimulate the nerves and muscles to produce movement. It enables stroke survivors to achieve movement in their weak side, helping them to regain muscle strength and function.

Designed by Kai Yang, Professor of E-textiles in Healthcare, and her team based at the University's Winchester School of Art (WSA), the glove could offer an accessible rehabilitation tool for stroke survivors to use at home.

Kai explained: "I wanted to develop something easy for stroke survivors to use at home. People who have had a stroke get fatigued easily, so engaging in long rehabilitation sessions is very challenging. This glove enables them to work on their rehab in small blocks of time when it suits them. With stroke rehabilitation, the more you practise movement, the more you regain muscle strength and mobility."

The prototype glove was developed using WSA's industrial knitting machines. Then electrodes were printed inside the knitted sleeve and connected to an electronic control unit, allowing the user to vary the stimulation level as required.

The prototype was tested by stroke survivor Dave Lea, through a collaboration with Different Strokes Southampton, a charity run by stroke survivors.

"it's life-changing," says Dave. "It means I can move my hand – something I've been unable to do for eight years."

Kai is now looking to refine the design of the prototype glove by working with more stroke survivors.

"We are delighted with the prototype and would like to see this become a product that's available to all stroke survivors, to help improve their recovery and their quality of life."



EDUCATING YOUNG PEOPLE ON VAPING RISKS

The University's LifeLab team has been working with local young people to create educational resources about the dangers of vaping. These resources are now being used by secondary schools in Southampton to spread awareness, and the project has influenced national change by directly informing government policy.

Youth vaping is a major issue across the UK, with research finding that the number of 11–17-year-olds regularly vaping almost doubled from four per cent to seven per cent between 2020 and 2022*

LifeLab, a teaching laboratory based at the University of Southampton, is dedicated to improving adolescent health by working with school pupils. Its Youth Panel, employs six 14–18-year-olds recruited from across Hampshire, to work on a 12-week project, which provides a young person's perspective on topical health issues.

The team at LifeLab brought in John Holloway, Professor of Allergy and Respiratory Genetics at the University, to share his expertise with the Youth Panel about the risks of youth vaping. The Panel then worked with him and the team at LifeLab to co-create resources, which include teaching activities, informative cards, real-life case studies and a virtual reality experience.

Additionally, the Youth Panel used insights from focus groups carried out with young people in Southampton to respond to a call for evidence from the government, the results of which support the recent ban on disposable vapes in the UK.

Madeleine Harris, age 17, is one of the Youth Panel members. "This project is important because of the high numbers of young people vaping," she says. "I'm very proud of this work and hope it will have a lot of impact."

TARGETING CHILDHOOD VACCINES GLOBALLY

Almost 10 million children worldwide are unvaccinated, putting them at risk of serious illness from diseases such as measles and polio

Southampton research group WorldPop is at the forefront of transforming global healthcare and vaccination initiatives. Over the last decade, WorldPop has worked in partnership with governments, UN agencies and philanthropic organisations to deliver a suite of data and mapping solutions. This innovative approach empowers nations to effectively monitor infectious diseases and administer vaccines to populations that were previously unreachable.

Vaccines protect us from infectious diseases by working with our immune system, teaching it to recognise specific disease-causing bacteria or viruses. Children are particularly vulnerable to many infectious diseases, but for a children's vaccination programme to be effective, it needs to reach a large proportion of the population.

"Our datasets enable governments to see where the unvaccinated children in their population are, which is crucial for the success of their vaccination campaigns," says Professor Andy Tatem, Director of WorldPop.

"What makes WorldPop distinctive is our ability to combine information from diverse data sources – ranging from mobile phone records and satellite imagery to traditional census data and AI algorithms – to produce comprehensive, open access maps that countries can use," Andy adds.

Today, WorldPop datasets are guiding strategic decisions of governments and health organisations worldwide. The team has collaborated with over 20 countries directly, as well as providing population data to inform global strategies for reducing the number of unvaccinated children. Through this work, WorldPop has supported numerous vaccination campaigns, including those for measles, polio, diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis and COVID.



ADAPTING TO WARMER WATERS

Marine life is shifting due to warmer ocean temperatures, a phenomenon known as tropicalisation. Southampton researchers have identified the scale of tropicalisation and its widespread repercussions for ecosystems, biodiversity and potentially the global economy.

In recent years, rising global temperatures have enabled the migration of species from warmer tropical waters to cooler temperate zones. This movement involves a diverse range of marine life, from corals, mangrove trees and algae to marine snails, reptiles and manmals.

Karolina Zarzyczny, a Southampton PhD student, conducted a comprehensive review of tropicalisation research spanning two decades - a pioneering effort highlighting gaps in understanding and the importance of safeguarding marine ecosystems.

Karolina explains: "Tropicalisation is rapidly restructuring the combination of marine species that are present in areas of the oceans. This rapid change is not just a conservation concern, but also a socio-economic one given our reliance on the services the ocean provides."

While tropicalisation may boost scuba diving tourism in areas with an influx of tropical corals and fish, it may also detrimentally impact global fisheries, and lead to a decline in ecologically and economically important macroalgae that provide a home to a wide range of marine species.

There is an urgent need for more research into the drivers and repercussions of tropicalisation, says Karolina, and there are actions we can all take on an everyday basis to help:

"The key here is that we need to tackle the climate crisis," says
Karolina. "Making positive changes in our daily lives to reduce our
carbon footprint, for example reducing our energy use, is something
we can all do to help.
